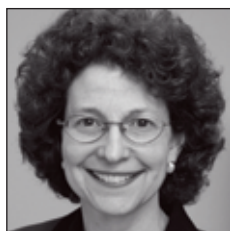


Phyllis Dennery, MD

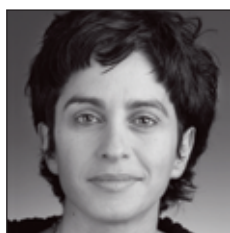
Professor of Pediatrics, University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine

Phyllis Dennery, MD, is a Professor of Pediatrics with tenure at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. Dr Dennery also holds the Werner and Gertrude Henle Endowed Chair in Pediatrics at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. Her area of research interest is in the regulation of lung gene expression in oxidative stress, in particular the role of heme oxygenase, the rate-limiting enzyme in bilirubin production. She is an active member of many professional and scientific societies including the American Thoracic Society (ATS), the American Pediatric Society and the Society for Pediatric Research (APS/SPR). She serves as an editor for *Free Radicals in Biology and Medicine*. She is a reviewer for the National Institutes of Health (NIH). ■

Amy Paller, MD is Professor and Walter J Hamlin Chair of Dermatology and Professor of Pediatrics at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. Her clinical interests focus on genetic disorders of the skin and cutaneous immunologic disorders. She recently completed a term as President of the Society for Pediatric Dermatology (SPD), is currently President-Elect of the Society for Investigative Dermatology, and is a Director of the American Board of Dermatology (ABD). An author of more than 300 publications, Dr Paller is a National Institute of Health (NIH)-funded investigator. ■
